

Glistening Inkcap *Coprinus micaceus*
[Phillips (2006) p260] [ECSS visit
No.46]. Very common, in tufts on and
around broadleaved stumps or buried
wood late spring to early winter. Cap
ovate, expanding to bell-shaped the
margin becomes split and sometimes
rolled back. Grooved from margin almost
to centre. Stem white, discolouring buff
in lower part. No smell. Gills white,
becoming brown and finally black. Spore
print date-brown. Edible.
