

Yellowleg Bonnet *Mycena epiterygia* [Phillips (2006) p85]. [Yellow at the top of the stalk. Cuticle on stalk loose, can be pulled. BF - Phillips does not mention these characteristics?]. Common, in grass or amongst moss in woodland or on heaths; autumn. Cap convex, expanding to bell shaped, margin often delicately toothed; fawn, especially at the centre, with yellowish tinge, lined appearance when moist; surface sticky, easily removed. Stem pale yellow, sticky; but see above. Flesh smell slight, not distinctive. Gills pale pink. Edible; but not worthwhile!
